
On June 4, Bob Warfield, son of Robert and Virginia Warfield, visited Jaffrey and donated to us three birds from his own personal collection – this is in addition to the five he had purchased from a private collection in Massachusetts and donated to us.

Additionally, the Jaffrey Public Library has given the JHS their own collection of 14 Warfield Birds, along with the display case they had been using. Though a prominent feature of the library for many years, the library needed more space to carry out its recent change in direction and purpose. In their desire to ensure that the birds would still be prominently and safely displayed in town, the trustees decided the JHS was the most obvious recipient.

The Library recently acquired a grant to completely digitize the Amos Fortune collection – soon the manumission papers, deeds, records, and other miscellaneous papers will be accessible in digital form all over the world! These will also be displayed in our collection – perhaps in the SECOND display case the library has thoughtfully given us! Jaffrey Time Capsule - The Jaffrey Outing Club -

any JHS members will remember the Jaffrey Outing Club. First organized in 1931 as a non-profit to give healthful recreation through the winter months to the youth of Jaffrey, over 300 people signed up as members. A skating rink was set up at Cheshire Pond, with a warming hut. From these humble beginnings, the club grew rapidly and became best known for the 3-day winter carnival held in February every year.

The carnival kicked off with the Grand Carnival Ball on Friday nights. Typically, a popular act came to play the union hall. In 1936, it was Jerry Goodrich and



his Bermudians. The following year it was the Boston act of Schoolboy Joe Lewis. Selection and coronation of the carnival queen takes place on the first night. Some of us may even have been the carnival queen, albeit probably not in 1936!

The early winter carnivals became well-known in the area and drew large crowds. Admission was 50 cents and got you a button and a program. In 1935 the event featured skating, skiing, snowshoeing, coasting, obstacle races, horse racing on ice, swimming and diving exhibitions, hockey, a wood chopping contest, and the finals of the New England Sled Dog Championships. On Sunday Feb. 24 of that year, through the cooperation of the Boston & Maine railroad, "Snow Trains" came to Jaffrey, four from Boston and one from Worcester.

In addition to the above-listed activities, on Sunday there was also a "sports costume" dance and square dancing. The sled dogs returned, and they held a massive bonfire before the departure of the snow trains at 6:00 pm. 1935 also saw the grand opening of the new 1.5-mile ski trail down Mt. Monadnock.

Lest you wonder about swimming and diving in mid-February, it occurred. The Manchester Brownies Troop came and dove from a 40-ft ladder. In 1936, they added motorcycle runs thru flames and crashing a barrier. This was also the year that Edmund Carey deeded his farm to the Outing Club, a 100-acre tract today known as Carey Park.

At the 1937 carnival, Johnny Newton and his 14 Swingsters played the carnival ball, and the queen was chosen by three judges. In 1938, an 1800-ft toboggan chute was constructed in Carey Park, and a ski jump. There was a lighted skating rink on the property and a warming hut that sold sandwiches and beverages.

As active members of the Jaffrey Outing club "aged out" and interest in its activities waned, they disbanded in 1972 and gave Carey Park to the Town of Jaffrey. JHS has a lot of information about the first few years of the annual Jaffrey Winter Carnival, but if anyone has any memories or ephemera about the event from the 1960s or early 1970s, we would like to know about it.

ANNUAL MEETING

Thursday, August 14 - 6 pm

his year our Annual Meeting will occur at the Jaffrey Civic Center on August 14. We'll have light refreshments starting at 6 pm and start the business meeting soon thereafter. When the business meeting is completed, we will walk down the block and get a special tour of the new Town Offices in the former Monadnock Bank building by Jaffrey's Town Manager, Jon Frederick. Please join us!

At the Annual Meeting we will be voting on a few Board members, officers, and on several amendments to the bylaws. You must be present to vote. Here are the proposed bylaw changes:

ARTICLE FOUR

At the end of the second paragraph add: The President shall appoint two members of the Society, who may be Board members but not officers, or outside auditors, to audit once a year in July all financial transactions and make a written report of their findings to the President and the Executive Team by August 1st each year. The auditor appointments shall not be considered Board members.

ARTICLE SIX

Replace the sentence "The Treasurer shall have charge of the current funds of the Society, and shall meet from them all duly authorized expenditures." with:

The Treasurer, President, and Immediate Past President shall be signatories on the Society's checking account and have authority to deposit and expend funds from said account when so authorized by vote of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE NINE

Replace the sentence "Of the income from such funds, Ten Percent (10%) shall always be added to the principal and the remainder shall be added to the general funds of the Treasurer, or at the option of the trustees, held in the Trust Fund for later use by the JHS." with:

Of the income from the funds, ten percent (10%) of the primary fund, referred to as the General Fund, shall always be added to the principal and the remainder shall be held by the Trustees in an accessible reserve sub-account to be known as the Board of Directors Fund (BODF) within the Endowment Fund. Said remainder may at any time be transferred to the general operating account for specified expenditure, by a two thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the Board of Directors present at such announced meeting to cast a vote.

ARTICLE ELEVEN

Replace the words "permanent funds" with: Principal of the Endowment Fund.
